




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# Mitre Blanket

All except version 2 use a combination of 3 yarns including mohair, Silkroad DK Tweed and either Alpaca Kid Lustre or Alpaca Silk Georgette. The resulting blanket is very lightweight. Version 2 uses Classic DK Wool in place of mohair which makes this blanket heavier than the other versions.

## Mitered Square Blanket

This handsome throw is worked in neutral or charcoal tones and will fit in comfortably in any home. The pattern is very easy, with only knit rows and a few other simple techniques. Its a project that you may pick up or put down without losing your place and may be attempted by beginner knitters once the knitting basics are mastered.

Knitting Rating: Novice

### NEEDLES

1 pair 5.50 mm needles (USA 10.5) (UK 2)

### MEASUREMENTS

**Width** 109 cm

**Length** 127.5 cm

### TENSION

16 sts and 32 Rows measured over 10 cm using 5.50mm needles and working in the pattern and three yarns given below.


### COLOUR REPEAT SEQUENCE

**Row 1** Col A

**Row 2** Col B

**Row 3** Col C

Repeat these three colours throughout. Refer to colour versions on previous page for yarn types, shades and volumes for versions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, & 9.



### PATTERN NOTES

The diagonal line on each square is called a miter. This is created created by decreasing one stitch in the centre of each row. A marker is placed after each decrease to eliminate the need to keep count. The number of stitches either side of the marker are even in every alternate row and uneven in every other row. This is correct and results in a neat diagonal centred miter. After knitting the first square, each subsequent square is started by picking up stitches along the edge of the previous square until a column of squares is formed. This is repeated until there are five columns which are then sewn together to form the blanket.

### Pattern Notes Cont.

**Contrast yarns** Once three shades have been introduced, these strands may be picked up to continue knitting with in subsequent rows, rather than joining a new strand with each colour change. The pattern is designed so that the required colour is always available at the beginning edge. Using existing strands avoids having many ends to darn in on project completion. Colour B will need to be broken and rejoined each time a new square is started.

### BLANKET

**Make first square** With 5.50mm needles and col A cast on 70 Stitches. Follow colour repeat sequence throughout (above left) AT THE SAME TIME work rows as follows;

**Row 1** K34, k2tog, place marker, k to end.

**Row 2** K to marker, remove marker, k2tog, place marker, k to end. Repeat row 2 until 3 sts remain (67 rows).

**Row 68 (WS)** K3 tog ,1 st remains.

This first square should measure, 21.8 cm wide x 21.25 long.

**Make second square** Using the one remaining stitch from the first square as the first stitch for the second square, and keeping cast on tail at bottom right hand corner, pick up and knit 34 sts evenly along top edge of work (35sts in all). Turn work and cast on a further 35 sts from last stitch (70sts). Repeat Rows 1 to 68.

Continue in this way until 6 squares together form the first strip of the blanket.

Cast off last stitch. The first strip should measure 21.8cm wide and 127.5cm long.

Now make a further 4 strips (5 strips in all). To complete blanket, sew strips together using edge to edge stitch.
